



# GREATER HYDERABAD MUNICIPAL CORPORATION



The Hyderabad Traffic Integrated Management System (H-TRIMS) of the City Traffic Police bagged the award for best practice projects in urban transportation under the ‘Best Intelligent Transport System Project’ category. This was announced during the 10th Urban Mobility India conference, which began here on Saturday.

Hyderabad is one of the most developing cities in India and every day, over 700 new vehicles are added onto the roads. The existing usable road is 8.32 per cent against the 14 to 18 per cent on other metro cities. The city’s vehicle density of 723 per kilometre, is second largest in the country.

Considering all these factors, the Hyderabad Traffic Police in association with the Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation (GHMC) launched H-TRIMS a few years back. The State Government had sanctioned Rs.66.50 crore for the project.

The project provides signaling service round the clock at 221 junctions and is remotely managed from the Traffic Control Centre. The project features include 221 signals enabled with virtual loop cameras for Adaptive Traffic Control and synchronized signals.
